A coil of stamps makes the desk mess a little less messy. This coil stamp holder provides a nice desk accessory.

Andy Rooney was a favorite closer for the TV show "60 Minutes" from 1978 to 2011. He was a classical curmudgeon. He could not be approached on the daily commuter train from CT to NYC by any fellow passenger without being rebuffed.

After he died, there was an estate sale for everything in his home. I went there on the second day of the sale, anticipating reduced prices on unsold items. I found and purchased Andy's brass desk set that included a coil stamp holder. This is a copy of that and I find it useful.

Because PLA is much lighter than brass, I added magnets in the top and center post. These are optional. The top stays on without the magnets. You can also use a 1/4" x 3 mm round steel rod in place of one magnet. This reduces the chance of placing the magnets in opposition, which requires reprinting. (I know.)

This makes a nice stocking stuffer.

6 mm x 3 mm magnets, 150 pcs, \$8.00 Amazon

Steel rod, 1/4" x 3 mm, Home Depot

Super Glue or equal
