Put a lid on it!

No really, I included a lid. If you want to keep a lid on something.

Print settings

(for 0.4 mm nozzle and 0.2 mm layer height):

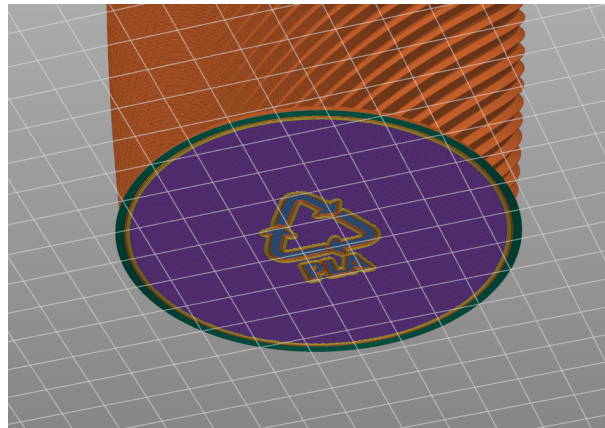
- 3 walls
- 5 bottom and 6 top layers
- no infill required, the model has internal structural parts
This will probably look bad if you use transparent infill.

I included a version without the in-print structural support (pot_nostruct.stl).

- no support needed

I'm not sure how well this scales. It should be ok to some degree... I didn't test it.

Free suggestion: put a plastic recycling symbol on the bottom. Prusaslicer has a few of them in the “Add negative volume” gallery. 20 Years from now the planet will thank you for recycling the thing correctly.



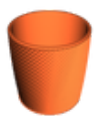

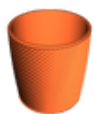
