Bes Figurine.

Bes, an ancient Egyptian deity, was worshipped as a protector of households, mothers, children, and childbirth. He later became associated with defending everything good and opposing all that is bad. His origins are believed to be from the **Kushite/Nubian or Nehesi C-Group culture**. Here are some fascinating facts about Bes:

Appearance: Initially, Bes was depicted as a **cat standing on its hind legs**, but over time, his representation became more anthropomorphic. He is often shown with a **leopard skin around his neck** and resembles a person with dwarfism.

Widespread Worship: Although Bes gained prominence during the **New Kingdom**, recent discoveries of Bes-like figurines date back to the **Naqada period** in pre-dynastic Egypt. His worship extended beyond Egypt, reaching as far as **Syria** and the **Balearic Islands (Ibiza)** in Spain, and even into the **Roman and Achaemenid Empires**.

Household Protector: Bes had a multifaceted role, including tasks like **killing snakes, warding off evil spirits**, and **aiding women in labor**. His images were kept in homes, and he was present during childbirth alongside the goddess **Taweret**.

Unique Depiction: Unlike other Egyptian gods, Bes was portrayed in **full face portrait**, often **ithyphallic** (with an erect phallus), and sometimes wearing a **soldier's tunic**.

Music and Dance: Bes was associated with music and dance. He played the **tambourine** and was depicted as dancing.
