Silhouettes of the most common birds of prey you can see in the landscape of Central Europe and easily distinguish them.

This is not an accurate bird identification tool, this is for children and therefore each silhouette can be mistaken for a different species. However, these are common, so this is mostly correct.

- Kestrel - can stay in one place in flight.
- Kite - characteristic V-shaped tail.
- Harrier - Wings in the shape of the Greek letter Σ . It flies low above the ground.
- Buzzard - The most common and largest . Often flies over a mown meadow or field to hunt rodents.
